Notes to students:

1. The Genus always starts with an upper case letter; the specific epithet always starts with a lower case letter.
2. Cultivar names are always capitalized and enclosed in single quotes.
3. Common names start with lower case letters unless a proper noun is used: i.e. Persian violet. A cultivar is considered a proper name because it is a specific selection of the species or hybrid: i.e. Tropic Snow dumbcane.
4. Technically, there should be no space between the hybrid "x" sign and the specific epithet. A space has been used in this list for the sake of clarity.
5. Information in parentheses and Plant Patent numbers do not have to be memorized.
